



How do I view Onshore Outcomes?

This task card demonstrates how to view the Onshore Outcomes after a search for a case has been conducted in BICON Web.

Onshore Outcomes include specific inspections, treatments, processing and/or testing. Onshore Outcomes include all activities up until the release, export or destruction of the goods.

1. View Onshore Outcomes

After you have conducted a search in BICON (via Quick Search, Scientific Name Search or Tariff Code Search), defined the import scenario by answering their questions, and navigated through the import conditions, you can view the onshore outcomes. Select [View Onshore Outcomes](#).

Case: Timber and Bamboo packaging Effective: 20 May 2015

If goods arrive as Full Container Load sea freight — Timber packaging — Timber is not ISPM 15 certified — Treat or inspect on arrival to Australia

Onshore Outcomes

a. Present all documentation

The importer or nominated agent must present all required documentation to the Department as part of the import procedure.

Direction: Documentation - Present all documentation

b. Mandatory treatment

The goods require **mandatory treatment** with either:

- Methyl bromide at 48g/m³ for 24 hours at 21°C at NAP;
- Heat treatment at 74°C for the approved kiln drying duration¹ or 56°C for 30 minutes;
- Ethylene oxide at 1200g/m³ at 50°C for 5 hours under an initial vacuum of 50 kilopascals or 1500g/m³ at 21°C for 24 hours at NAP;
- Gamma irradiation at 10 kGray (1 Mrad).

certificates as a prerequisite for the issuance of an INC for timber being treated.

If the treatment certificate is issued by a treatment provider accredited under an Department of Agriculture recognised offshore government program or its equivalent, the certificate must also include the name of the program under which the treatment provider is accredited and the facility registration number or treatment provider number issued under that program.

c. Release

The goods may be released from any further Quarantine Impediment as all quarantine conditions have been met.
