



How do I view Onshore Outcomes?

This task card demonstrates how to view Onshore Outcomes after a search for a case has been conducted in BICON. Onshore Outcomes include specific inspections, treatments, processing and/or testing. Onshore Outcomes include all activities up until the release, export, or destruction of the goods.

View Onshore Outcomes

Once you have conducted a search in BICON via **Quick Search**, **Scientific Search** or **Tariff Code Search**, defined the Import scenario by answering questions and navigated through the Import conditions, you can view the Onshore Outcomes.

Import Conditions

Import conditions define the biosecurity requirements which must be met for your import. Where import conditions have been developed, they will be listed below.

a. Prior to the importation of [goods](#) into Australian territory, a valid import permit issued by the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry is required. An import permit may be obtained by submitting an [import permit application](#) to the department (use the 'Apply Now' button at the bottom of this page). You will need to complete the [dairy import declaration form](#) as it is information that is required to accompany the application. Please ensure that the relevant information is provided by the manufacturer of the product.

Important reminder to importers

Goods that require a valid import permit, but arrive without one, including where an import permit application is currently under consideration, will be directed for export from Australian territory or required to be destroyed in an approved manner.

h. Under the [Biosecurity Charges Imposition \(General\) Regulation 2016 #](#) and Chapter 9, Part 7 of the [Biosecurity Regulation 2016 #](#), fees are payable to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry for all activities. Details on how the department applies fees and levies may be found in the [Charging guidelines #](#).

c. In addition to the conditions for the goods being imported, non-commodity concerns must be assessed including container cleanliness, packaging and destination concerns, and may be subject to inspection and treatment on arrival. Please refer to the [Non-Commodity Cargo Clearance BICON case](#) for further information.

d. Once biosecurity requirements have been met, it is the importer's responsibility to comply with the [Imported Food Control Act 1992 #](#) and ensure food being imported is safe and compliant with Australian standards including the [Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code #](#). Consignments of food may be referred for inspection and analysis under the [Imported Food Inspection Scheme #](#) to verify safety and compliance. Some foods, such as [beef #](#) and [raw milk cheese #](#), are not permitted to be imported without a [recognised foreign government certificate #](#).

What happens next?

a. Present all documentation

The importer or nominated agent must present all required documentation to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry as part of the import procedure.

The goods are to be directed for export. The export must be supervised by biosecurity staff and the export bill must be presented to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry.
